A VERY DIFFERENT KIND OF KINGDOM

"Hope That Outcasts the Headlines"

Key Phrase: "And you will hear of wars and threats of wars, but don't panic."

Scripture: Mark 13:5-13

• Jesus opens with the warning don't let anyone mislead you and then describes wars, earthquakes, and famines before calling these "the beginning of birth pains." What is your initial reaction to that list? Does it feel familiar, distant, or unsettling? What does it stir up in you?

• There is a long history of serious religious leaders who wrongly predicted the end of the world, yet people keep falling for it. Why do you think the pull to decode current events as signs of the end is so strong? What does that impulse reveal about what we are really looking for? Where have you felt that pull yourself?

• Jesus says "don't panic"; in the middle of describing genuinely scary things. But panic becomes impossible when you know who holds the future. Where in your life right now is fear about what is coming pulling your focus away from trust in God? What would it look like to hear Jesus say "don't panic" directly into that situation? What is one thing that would need to change for you to actually receive that command?

• Jesus says enduring to the end marks a mature faith, and that is contrasted that with both obsessive end-times tracking and spiritual apathy. Which ditch is more tempting for you personally? What would it look like to lead someone else away from that same ditch? What does wakeful, grounded faith actually look like in your daily life?

Read also: Hebrews 11:1; Psalm 46:1-10; Ephesians 5:14

Pick one or more of the applications below to put into practice this week ...

1. Choose Who, Not When. This week, whenever you catch yourself anxious about world events or uncertain about the future, deliberately redirect that energy by naming out loud what you know to be true about who God is rather than trying to figure out what is coming next. Spend five minutes each day this week reading one promise of God and sitting with it instead of scanning the news.
2. Get Your House in Order. Is your spiritual house in order today? Identify one area of your faith life you have been putting off, whether that is a broken relationship, a pattern of avoidance in prayer, or a next step of obedience you have been delaying, and take one concrete action toward it before the end of this week.

3. Be the Church for Someone. The church matters not because life is easy but because when life gets hard, it connects us to one another and to God in holy ways. Think of one person in your life who is currently following an ambulance of their own, carrying a burden nobody else can see, and reach out to them this week with a specific, tangible expression of care.
