WHO IS THIS?

“The Master of the Wind and the Waves!”

Key Phrase: Then he asked them, **“Where is your faith?”**

Scripture: **Luke 8:22-25**

- What do you think it would have felt like to be in that boat as the storm hit without warning? Have you ever experienced a moment where everything felt out of control all at once? What do you think causes people to feel most afraid in those situations?
- • Jesus was asleep in the middle of the storm while the disciples panicked. Why do you think God can feel distant or absent when life gets hard? Have you ever wondered if God actually cared about what you were going through? What helped you hold onto faith even when you couldn't feel God's presence?
- • Jesus asked the disciples, "Where is your faith?" What do you think Jesus was really asking them in that moment? Where do you tend to place your trust when things in your life start to feel shaken? What would it look like for you to actively place your faith in Jesus during your next storm?
- • The disciples were amazed that even the wind and waves obeyed Jesus. How can your own story of God's faithfulness in a storm become an encouragement to someone else? Who in your life right now is walking through a storm where they need to be reminded that Jesus is present? What is one practical way you could be there for that person this week?
- **Read also: Luke 5:17-26; Luke 7:36-50; Romans 8:38-39**

Pick one or more of the applications below to put into practice this week ...

1. **Name Your Storm** — Identify one storm you're currently facing, whether it's physical, emotional, or relational, and write down one specific way you'll choose to place your faith in Jesus rather than in the storm itself this week.
2. **Carry Someone to Jesus** — Like the friends who carried the paralyzed man, think of one person in your life who needs help getting to Jesus. Take one concrete step this week to walk alongside them, whether through a conversation, an invitation to church, or simply showing up.
3. **Live Forgiven-Much** — Reflect on how much you've been forgiven, and choose one person this week, especially someone who's hard to extend grace to, and show them the kind of love that flows from being forgiven much.
